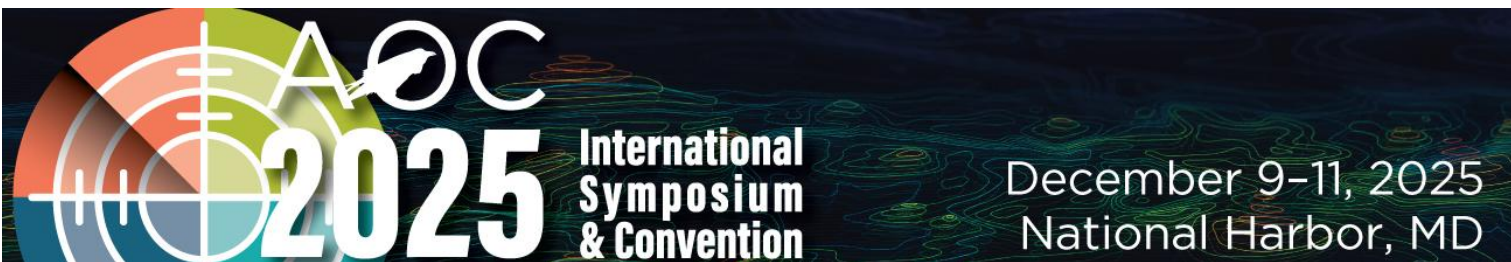


Terms and Conditions

1. As an international organization headquartered in the United States, Association of Old Crows (AOC) observes all U.S. laws designed to prevent the export of sensitive technology and technology implementation, and to protect American and international partner technological accomplishments from potential adversaries. Persons or entities that are in opposition to the interests of the United States and countries of concern for technology transfers are not eligible to attend AOC events. Your credentials will be reviewed for confirmation of eligible attendance at the annual AOC International Symposium and Convention (Symposium). **For security purposes, all registrants must show government-issued identification at badge pickup.**
2. All content presented during this Symposium is owned by AOC or the individual speakers and presenters authorized to take part in the Symposium. Delegates (including attendees, exhibitors, sponsors, speakers, media, etc.) are strictly prohibited from recording any content presented during the Symposium by any means, including audio, video and photographic methods. By agreeing to this statement and registering for the Symposium, you represent and warrant that you understand and agree to this prohibition against recording Symposium content and that you understand and acknowledge that any delegate who violates this policy will be escorted out of the session and their symposium credentials will be revoked for the remainder of the event. No refunds will be granted due to such violation.
3. By registering for and/or attending the Symposium, delegates understand and agree that they may be photographed, filmed, or videotaped and hereby give AOC and those acting with its permission to take pictures and/or recordings of such delegates, and grant the perpetual right to use their name, voice, photograph, portrait, and biographical information (collectively, "likeness"), without compensation, for broadcast or exhibition in any media now known or hereafter devised and to put the finished pictures/recordings to any lawful use without limitation or reservation. Delegates hereby waive, release, and forever discharge AOC from and against all claims or actions arising out of or resulting from any use of their likeness.
4. AOC will not share your contact information publicly or sell to third parties. Allowing exhibitors to scan your badge does allow your contact information to be shared with that exhibitor.
5. Any public space where other people are present holds an inherent risk of exposure to communicable diseases. AOC or any of their affiliates including partners and sponsors, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, volunteers, or sponsored venues will be taking all legal, prudent, and advisable measures to reduce the risk of virus/illness transmission between people while attending this event. Despite our best efforts, we will be unable to reduce the level of risk to zero. By attending this event, I agree to:
 - a. Voluntarily assume all risk related to exposure and agree to not hold the AOC or any of their affiliates including partners and sponsors, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, volunteers, or sponsored venues liable should I contract an illness or should anything else happen to me during my participation in this event. I will take necessary precautions while at the event including, but not limited to, engaging in appropriate social distancing, minimizing face touching and frequent hand-washing. Wearing a mask in public areas when not consuming food or beverage is encouraged for all non-vaccinated attendees.
6. All registration fees are due at the time of registration. If a delegate chooses to pay by check, the payment is due within 15 days of registering. If payment is not received by AOC within this time frame, AOC has the right to re-register the delegate at the current rate and bill the delegate the difference in price.

7. Pre-registered delegates must submit payment on or before November 11, 2025 or make special arrangements with the AOC registrar to bring payment to onsite registration. No credentials will be distributed without full payment.
8. All Symposium Registration cancellation requests must be made in writing and sent to events@crowns.org. Refund requests received on or before November 11, 2025, will be refunded minus a \$100 administrative fee. No refund requests will be honored after the November 11, 2025, deadline or for no-shows. Registration substitutions are permitted and can be submitted in writing at any time without penalty. Absolutely no cancellations will be accepted via telephone. **Please note canceling your registration does NOT cancel your hotel reservation; you must cancel separately according to the instructions on your hotel confirmation.**
9. Substitutions are permitted and requests must be emailed to events@crowns.org. Absolutely no substitutions will be accepted via telephone.
10. Each registered delegate will be issued an official badge during onsite registration. No admission will be granted to any session or function without this badge. Badges may not be shared or exchanged in any way. Violators' badges will be confiscated. Lost badges will be re-issued upon the delegate's presentation of proper identification.
11. Delegates must be 18 years of age to attend the Symposium or visit the Exhibit Hall.
12. The delegate agrees to indemnify and hold harmless AOC against all claims and damages, losses and charges of anything resulting from his or her participation in AOC's International Symposium and Convention.
13. If a Force Majeure Event occurs, the party that is prevented by that Force Majeure Event from performing any one or more obligations under this agreement (the "Nonperforming Party") will be excused from performing those obligations, on condition that it promptly notify the other party of occurrence of that Force Majeure Event, its effect on performance, and how long that party expects it to last and uses reasonable efforts to limit damages to the performing party. For purposes of this agreement, "Force Majeure Event" means any event or circumstance, including but not limited to: acts of God; war; riots; civil insurrections; cyclones; hurricanes; floods; fires; explosions; earthquakes; chemical contamination; epidemics; acts or threats of terrorism; trade restrictions; and acts of any Governmental Authority after the date of this Agreement, whether it was foreseeable, that prevents a party from performing any of its obligations under this agreement, except that a Force Majeure Event will not include a party's financial hardship, an increase in prices, or a change of law.
